Anointing of the Sick

The anointing of the sick is administered to bring spiritual and even physical strength during an illness or especially near the time of death. A parishioner who is in need of the Sacraments of healing, if possible should call personally or have an immediate family member call the parish office to schedule a priest to visit. The sacrament conveys several graces and imparts gifts of strengthening by the Holy Spirit against anxiety, discouragement, temptation and conveys peace and fortitude. As soon as one feels the effects of age, illness or the nearness of death, the time for the sacrament has already arrived.

Prayer Intentions and Requests

If you would like to be remembered in prayer, please call the parish office with the name of family members who are ill and whom you wish to be remembered in prayer. In order to respect rights to privacy, these names must be given **by a family member**. It is the responsibility of the person requesting a name on the list to update the parish office list, every two weeks. If we do not hear from you, the assumption is that person has recovered sufficiently to be taken off the Prayer List. Continuing prayer for those we love is very important for all involved, therefore we ask that you call the Parish Office (480) 488-2229, Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. so we may provide a current prayer list.

Welcome to Our Lady of Joy! Please be aware that because of the pandemic of the H1N1 flu virus potentially spreading amongst parishioners, the *optional* "exchange of the sign of peace" as well as the distribution of the Precious Blood has been suppressed for this Sunday's Liturgy. Suppressed does not mean forever. This is only to attempt to safeguard the wellbeing of each person's health here at Our Lady of Joy. There have been at least 4 confirmed swine flu cases at Our Lady of Joy as of 10/3/09. This year in Maricopa County alone there have been nearly 4,000 confirmed cases as reported by the AZ Health Department. For those who have flu like symptoms, I encourage you to please stay at home where you may watch the mass live at 9a.m. on Cox 13, which is televised from our Cathedral of Ss. Simon and Jude.

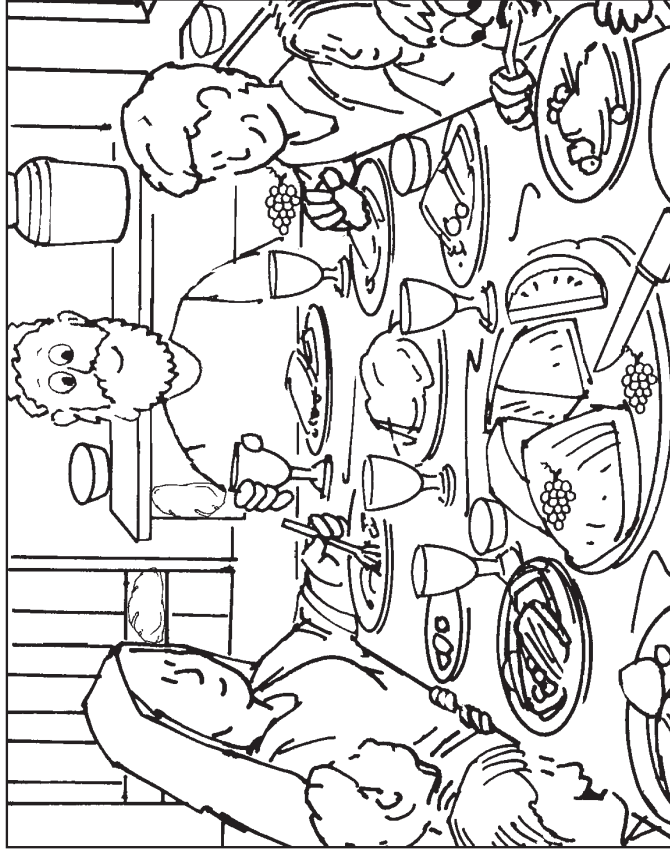

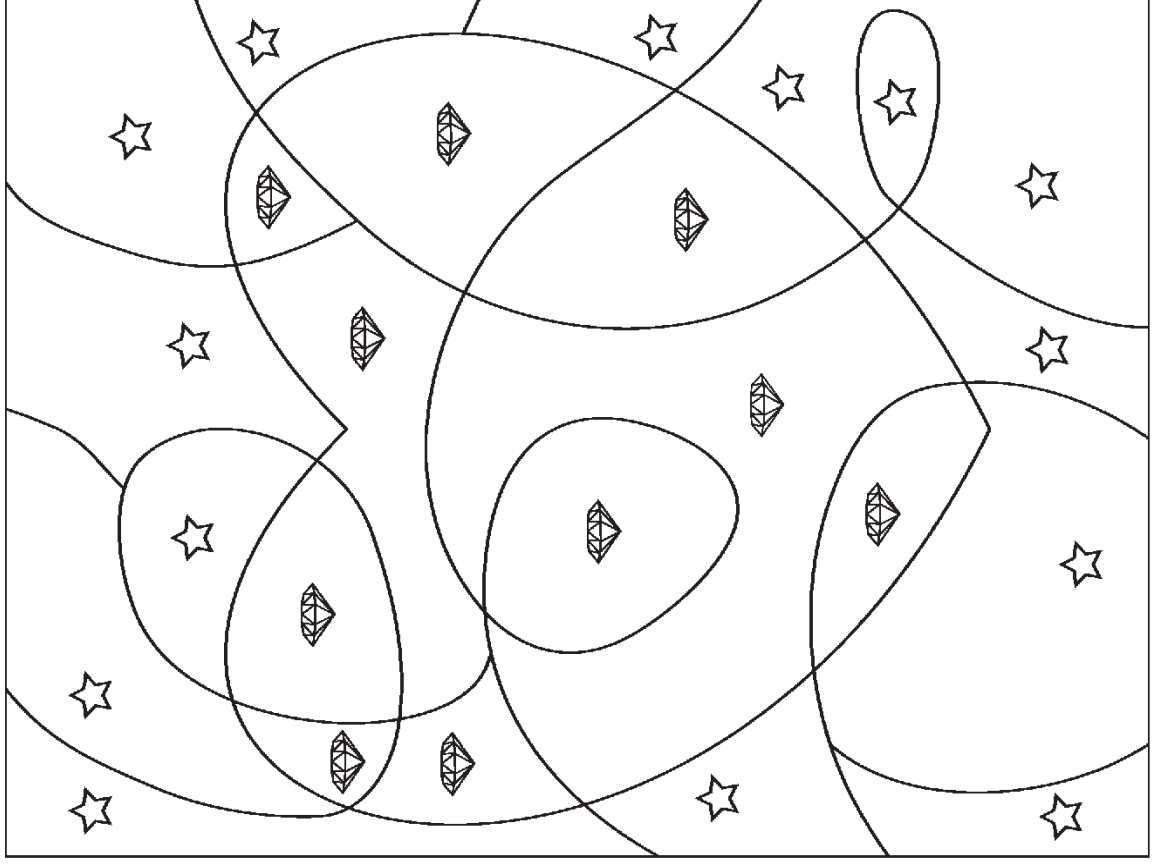
