Anointing of the Sick

The anointing of the sick is administered to bring spiritual and even physical strength during an illness or especially near the time of death. A parishioner who is in need of the Sacraments of healing, if possible should call personally or have an immediate family member call the parish office to schedule a priest to visit. The sacrament conveys several graces and imparts gifts of strengthening by the Holy Spirit against anxiety, discouragement, temptation and conveys peace and fortitude. As soon as one feels the effects of age, illness or the nearness of death, the time for the sacrament has already arrived.

Prayer Intentions and Requests

In order to respect rights to privacy, these names must be given **by a family member**. It is the responsibility of the person requesting a name on the list to update the parish office list, every two weeks. Dear Parish Family,

In just a few more days, Lent will be upon us. Ash Wednesday is the 17th of February, whereby we will be marked with the burned but blessed palms on our foreheads. The words, "Burned but blessed" indicate a double character of Lent. Lent is first, a season to prepare more profoundly our catechumens and candidates, both with the rite of election and Scrutinies. By catechesis, the catechumens (those who are un-baptized) and candidates (those who have been baptized) are to be readied for the sacraments of initiation (Confirmation and Eucharist). Secondly, all of us as God's children are called to be ever more attentive to holy life that we have been called to live. The season of Lent invites us to listen more intensely to the Word of God, to more fervent prayer, and we are encouraged to actively seek out penance so as to joyfully renew of our Baptismal promises at Easter.

Lent runs from Ash Wednesday until the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. All memorials of saints occurring during Lent are observed as optional. That means they may be omitted to attend wholly to the Season's purpose: preparation for the Resurrection. The sanctuary and décor of the Church is less festive and a touch more stark. The Lenten season's proclamation within the Church takes up the themes of baptismal renewal and penance. Or, said another way, our readings "call us, as God's people, to conversion."

Each Friday evening here at Our Lady we'll pray the stations of the Cross and meditate upon the passion of our Lord with grateful hearts for all that he has given to us. Stations will begin at 5pm. After Stations of the Cross, our Parish Hall will be opened for a smorgasbord of delicious fish (baked and fried). Praying together and eating together is an essential building block for communal life and community. Fish Fry's will be each Friday during Lent except March 19th. For those who are interested in joining the Italians here at Our Lady of Joy, for a festive celebration; St. Joseph's Table will be March 21st after the 11am mass.

Throughout Lent, I would also like to invite you to visit Our Risen Lord in the Eucharist. An opportunity to adore the Blessed Sacrament as well as celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation will be provided Mondays and Wednesdays during Lent from 6:00pm to 7:00pm. Please know of my prayers for you and your family each day throughout this Holy Season.

Still in our day, Catholics have questions about fasting and abstinence. Abstinence is a virtue that inclines a person to moderate use of food and drink. Abstinence for us means one does not eat meat on Ash Wednesday, Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Catholics abstain from meat because on a Friday, the Good Lord gave up his flesh for the life of the world. Fish is ok, but pork, beef and chicken are off the menu for most of us. See below.

Some words about fasting. Fasting is a form of penance that imposes limits on the kind or quantity of food or drink. Christians have observed the practice of fasting since the very beginning of Christianity. The constitution of Pope Paul VI in 1966, "Paenitemini" states that fasting is bound for those faithful who have completed their 18th year and up until the beginning of their 60th year. Yet it has been left to the Bishops or Episcopal conferences to establish other norms. Universal days of fasting for the United States are January 22nd (anniversary Roe v. Wade), Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and Fridays during Lent. In short, that means for us that we eat one full meal during the day with a light breakfast and a snack. On your own, you discern (figure out) how to best accomplish this. Those who's health is compromised or otherwise must take medicine with food are not obliged. The austerity of our fast should compromise our health but should be a selfless and physical giving up of some good to spiritually create need for God. In lieu of fasting for young or old, one might add a particular devotion or prayers to their spiritual life.

It is true to say that we have all taken liberties with God. Now in this holy season, for the forgiveness of our sins, we fast, we repent and we turn to the Living God with faithful hearts.

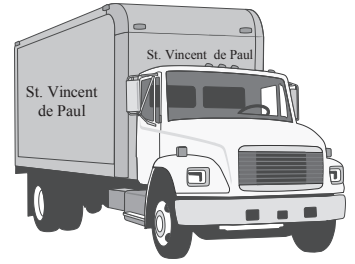

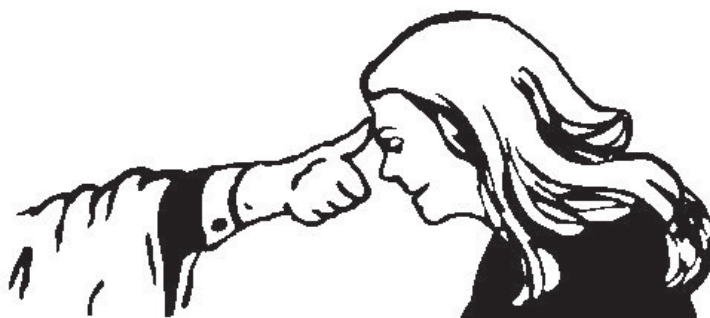
