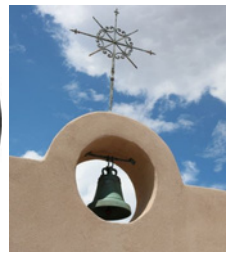

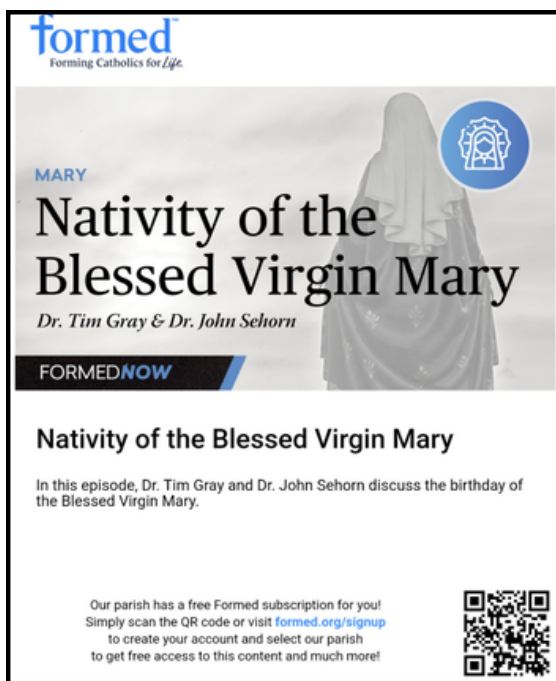

WHAT'S ON FORMED NOW?

Before the Word became flesh, God prepared a dwelling place and her name is Mary. The Nativity of Our Lady is the hope of the entire world and the dawn of salvation. Celebrated on September 8th each year, this feast invites the faithful to pause and marvel at the sheer weight of what this one birth set in motion. The birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary is one of only three liturgical feasts in which the Church celebrates a birth: The birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ, the birth of Saint John the Baptist, and the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Only the three most consequential figures in the Bible receive the honor of a liturgical celebration to commemorate their births.



A MESSAGE FROM FR. JESS

Dear Family of God,

Why is fraternal correction necessary?

To correct an erring brother or sister, especially when they are young, is a form of love, we call them tough love. We care enough for them that we don't want them to persist in error that will result in self-destruction or even lead them to prison in the long run.

Sin is a lack of love. The Catechism of the Catholic Church on paragraph 2083ff explains why different sins are actually a failure of love. 2087 says, our moral life has its source in faith in God who reveals his love to us. St. Paul speaks of the 'obedience of faith' as our first obligation. He shows us that "ignorance of God" is the principle and explanation of all moral deviations." (see Romans 1:18-32) verse 25 says, "They exchanged the truth of God for a lie and revered and worshiped the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen."

If we are silent or neglect our obligation to correct our neighbor, then God will hold us accountable. God said through prophet Ezekiel: *"If I tell the wicked, 'O wicked one, you shall surely die', and you do not speak out to dissuade the wicked from his way, the wicked shall die for his guilt, but I will hold you responsible for his death."*

Brothers and sisters this is serious, we cannot keep silent when our neighbors are perishing. Death here is not only physical death, but eternal death. It is better to hurt their feelings for a moment now, than for all of us to suffer the consequences of our inaction in eternity.

May Our Lady of Joy help us all to be her Son, meek and humble of heart.

We all know how to say the rosary (hopefully). We all know how to go to Adoration. We all know the Our Father and the Hail Mary. But do we know how to actually BE with Him?

Imagine meeting a new friend and all they ever do is talk. They never listen and they are unable to just pass the time with you. How deep will this friendship go? Could it be meaningful if this is all it is? You have likely experienced this. Did the relationship progress? Are you still friends? Do you keep in touch? Do you feel close to that person?

Our routine prayers are very important and should continue. But do we ever just rest in His presence? This is what we have to do with Jesus.

We have to be careful with "go-go-go." Our minds learn patterns of rushing and we lose our ability for stillness. Satan sure likes this, but we sure don't want to make him happy, right? We have to learn how to say no. We have to learn to discern when to say yes and understand that sometimes the answer is "no." Can you say, "Sorry, I can't make it," to an invitation and attend a second mass over the weekend? Adoration? One to two weekday masses?

Be honest with yourself - do you have FOMO (fear of missing out)? The only FOMO you should have is missing out on Jesus, and that's it.

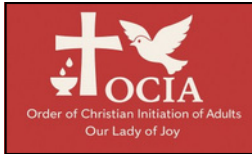

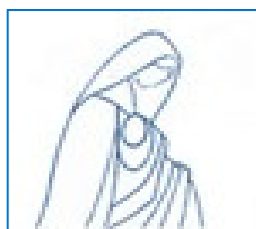
